Curriculum Integration

Overview:

A structured pathway that develops citizenship education across four years of vocational training. Includes three modular areas: introduction to civic values, understanding EU and national institutions, and digital citizenship. Uses a blend of theoretical, practical, and project-based learning

Description of the practice

This practice offers a **possible educational pathway** for **citizenship education** aimed at students in VET pathways from the first to the fourth year, following a "vertical" approach as a support tool for trainers. The educational program is divided into three main modules: Introduction to **Citizenship Education**, **Democratic Institutions** and **European Citizenship, Digital Citizenship**. The practice incorporates lectures, case studies, debates, role-playing and project-based learning activities.

Teaching methodology

- Project-based learning, debates, role-playing, experiential learning, and digital resources.

Resources and tools used

- Digital platforms, printed materials, case studies, EU official documents and online interactive tools.

Innovative aspects

- Introduces a vertical curriculum spanning multiple years.
- Adapts existing methodologies to VET
- Incorporates both in-person and digital engagement strategies.

Target group:

VET students aged 14–19

Duration of the activity:

Multi-year vertical curriculum

Transferability Tip:

Use the modular structure to gradually deepen topics. Tailor each phase to students' level of maturity and field of study.

EU Focus Areas:

European institutions and policies, Civic participation and democracy, Fundamental rights and European values, Social inclusion and equal rights, Sustainable development and green EU initiatives, Digital citizenship and online responsibility.
