EU Simulation & Roleplay



Overview:

Students take part in a regional EU Parliament model simulation over three days.

Descriprion of the practice

This educational event simulates the workings of the European Parliament. Participants are assigned roles as **Members of the European Parliament** (MEPs) and work in committees to draft, debate, and vote on resolutions concerning current European issues.

The event aims to enhance students' understanding of European institutions, democratic processes, and the importance of active citizenship.

Why is this approach useful?

This approach immerses students in the legislative process, providing a practical understanding of how the European Parliament functions. By engaging in debates and decisionmaking, students gain insights into the complexities of European governance and the significance of their participation in democratic processes.

How to make this approach successful?

Establish a clear framework for the event. collaborate with partners, offer preparatory sessions for students, ensure logistics and collect feedback

Target group:

Students aged 16-18, teachers

Duration of the activity:

3 days

Transferability Tip:

Scale down to classroom level using simplified debate formats.

Why is it a quick win?

it leverages existing educational structures and resources, requiring minimal additional investment. It increases student engagement with EU topics, enhances understanding of democratic processes, and develops teamwork and communication.
