# Overview:

## Description of the practice

Students are encouraged to explore the EU's role in providing work, internships, education, and cultural exchange. Through interactive workshops and practical assignments, students will examine how European collaboration impacts their future careers and opens up opportunities in the European labor market.

This approach ensures that students actively engage with European citizenship, democracy, and policy debates, developing critical thinking, communication skills, and civic awareness. The collaboration with external experts provides firsthand insights into EU governance, making learning more dynamic and relevant.

## How to make this approach successful?

Start by partnering with experts like the Antonio Megalizzi Foundation for structured activities and discussions. Integrate activities into the curriculum by linking them to history, law or civic education.

Fourth year students

6 hours in total (divided into 3 lessons of 2 hours each)
