Overview:

Students are encouraged to explore the EU's role in providing work, internships, education, and cultural exchange. Through interactive workshops and practical assignments, students will examine how European collaboration impacts their future careers and opens up opportunities in the European labor market.

Description of the practice

Providing vocational education students (in their BPV phase) the opportunity to gain insight into the European Union and the opportunities it offers.

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Why is this approach useful?

it shows students how Europe impacts their professional future. By linking the topic to their future work practices, EU-related matters become concrete and relevant. It raises awareness of European opportunities eg. to work in various EU countries. This boosts their chances in the European job market.

How to make this approach successful?

Collaborate with local businesses, EU institutions, or schools. Organize workshops or guest lectures focused on EU opportunities. Use real-life examples. Use interactive tools and discussions to engage students actively.

Target group:

Vocational education students (BPV phase), aged 16-20

Duration of the activity:

2-4 hours

Transferability Tip:

Ensure successful transferability, collaborate with experienced partners, plan engaging sessions, share real-life EU success stories, and use interactive methods to actively involve participants.

Why is it a quick win?

Easy to implement within the existing BPV curriculum. It requires minimal resources: using online materials and resources from EU institutions. Visible results: increased student awareness about the opportunities available in Europe.
