Overview:

KA1-funded visits to EU institutions with preparation activities, guided meetings, and follow-up.

Description of the practice

A highlight of the school's European engagement is the annual study trip to Brussels, organized in collaboration with the Trentino Region office in Brussels. **This opportunity is open to ten students per school from three institutions and offers direct insight into European governance.**

During the trip, students:

- Visit key European institutions
- Attend European Commission meetings
- Participate in debates on EU policies

Why is this approach useful?

It combines experiential learning with structured preparation, ensuring that students gain both theoretical knowledge and practical insights. It transforms EU education into an interactive, real-world experience, making learning more impactful and relevant to students' lives.

How to make this approach successful?

- Establish a project team
- Collaborate with the regional office in Brussels
- Plan at least six months in advance
- Address potential challenges
- Select motivated students.

Target group:

Fourth year students

Duration of the activity:

2–3 days

Transferability Tip:

- Partner with regional offices or Erasmus+ mobility consortia for logistical support.
- Easy to replicate with other schools and regions, as it follows a structured approach.

Why is it a quick win?

- Easily implementable and requires minimal resources
- Financially supported by KA1 Erasmus+
- Can be repeated annually with few adjustments.
