Description of the practice

"Team Europe" program operated by the European Commission Representation provides guest lecturers to schools on various EU-related topics.

This initiative aims to **bring expertise directly into the classroom, enriching students' understanding of the EU and its impact.**

Why is this approach useful?

Team Europe guest lecturers offer schools free access to subject matter experts who can provide in-depth knowledge and perspectives on EU-related issues. The diversity of experts allows for a wide range of EU topics to be covered, catering to different student interests and curriculum needs.

How to make this approach successful?

Find suitable time for both the school and the expert. Engage the students to attend and participate (eg. a mandatory component of a related course). Make students see the value and relevance of the lecture.

Target group:

Students aged 16-19 years

Duration of the activity:

2 hours

Transferability Tip:

Coordinate with the Commission Representation to match topics with your curriculum. Schools should align lecture topics with student interests or course modules, and actively promote attendance for maximum engagement.

Inviting a guest lecturer is a cost-free way for schools to enhance their EU education offerings. Guest lectures can have a significant impact on student knowledge, engagement, and critical thinking skills in a short amount of time.
